LESSON PLAN

LESSON:	Bibliographic Citation for a Book
Grade Level:	6, 7, 8
OBJECTIVES:	The student will be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Identify the 5 items needed for a book citation 2. Locate the 5 items on either the title page or the copyright page 3. Write a bib citation for a book using correct punctuation
MATERIALS:	Bib Citation for a Book video Bib Citation for a Book worksheet Handouts: Book Title Page & Book Copyright Page Books (nonfiction books on a topic you will be researching) Senteo Clickers for quiz
KEYWORDS:	Bibliographic citation, title page, copyright page, author, title, place of publication, publisher, year published
PROCEDURES:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Give each student a book and help them locate the title page and copyright page. 2. State that they will learn about 5 important pieces of information located on these 2 pages that will help them identify that book. 3. Watch video and answer worksheet questions. 4. Review worksheets. 5. Evaluate with Senteo Review packet.
EXTENSIONS OR ADAPTATIONS:	<p>MLA Style Bibliographic Citations Packet (to be used for all bibliographic citation lessons)</p> <p>Have students use books to locate the 5 parts of a book bib citation. Students can write a citation using that information.</p>
